The Residents were given time to talk before the meeting began.

Residents Issues

1. APOLOGIES: Councillor D Reed, District Councillor M Brown, Essex County Councillor Erskine.

2. DECLARATIONS

There were no declarations made.

3. MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON 5th October 2015

The Chairman proposed the updated minutes from last month, they were agreed by all and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

4. URGENT MATTERS ARISING

The Chairman stated that when emails were sent, Councillors should always reply to say that the email was received. He also said that if anyone was on a Committee and was expecting someone to contact them regarding meetings or tasks, they should contact someone else on the Committee to see if they had heard anything, rather than just wait. This is to guard against being missed out from any news or progress. Councillor De Vaux Balbirnie reported that he would now pre-arrange Planning Committee meetings on the last Friday of the month at 6pm just before the next meeting, so that applications could be discussed. Organising a date will save sending emails later in the month which could get missed. If anyone can't make it they should make arrangements to let Councillor De Vaux Balbirnie know.

The Chairman stated that he was happy for anyone to knock on his door or phone him with any village issues.

5. MATTERS BROUGHT FORWARD

(a) Highway Matters

Councillor Smith reported that orange lines had appeared along Holland Road. These have not been laid by Tendring District or Essex County Council, but by contractors in connection with the edging repairs. The Clerk was asked to contact Essex County Councillor Erskine to make enquiries.

Councillor De Vaux Balbirnie is to speak to Tendring District Council about the overgrown verges.

Councillor M Reed enquired if anyone can chop back the trees to enable the lights to be seen.

The chairman reported that he was in contact with the Tree surgeon in connection with cutting back the Horse Chestnut trees on the Green, and along Harwich Road.

6. POLICE/CRIME PREVENTION

Councillor J Rowland stated that there was no crime report available this month, and PC Haycraft may no longer be available to Little Clacton Parish as the Police Service was being restructured in Tendring. Councillor J Rowland is to put a letter together with Councillor M Reed to complain about the PCSO situation.

7. WORKING PARTY REPORTS (a) Maintenance and services The Chairman reported that a maintenance and services committee meeting had been held. Councillor S Rowland reported that the Contractor had not completed the task that was given to him. The Clerk was asked to check in the Parish office for contractors public liability schemes. The Chairman said that a further committee

meeting before the next parish meeting was necessary, and he would report back at the next Parish Meeting.

(i) Street lights Councillor M Reed reported that A and J Lighting contract was due to expire in March 2016. He will discuss this at the next meeting. He asked to meet A&J Lighting representatives to discuss details. The Chairman agreed that he could. Councillor M Reed reported lights out at MeadowView Park and enquired about the Mersey Homes development at Springfield Gardens, and whether the lights were owned by Essex County or Little Clacton Parish or were private.

- 1. Despite reduction in numbers the application is not sustainable and fails to conform with National Planning Framework (2012).
- 2. It does not conform to the core principles of paragraph 17 of the National Planning Framework as defined in the refusal 24/7/15.
- 3. The application is still of a size to be out of character with the village setting and looks to create urbanisation of the centre of the village.

- 4. The applicant suggests a sustainable infiltration drainage system to alleviate the flood risk but gives an alternative if this is proved unviable, to use existing ditches. This is totally unacceptable.
- 5. The applicant has not in our view addressed enough changes to satisfy paragraph 134 of the National Planning Framework as in the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas and Tendring District Council Local Plan.
- 6. Some ribbon development might be considered if it is in keeping with the village and street scene.

The Chairman reported that the website continues to be updated. The Police messaging service has been added. He asked the Clerk to check that the correct Standing Orders are shown.

9. TDALC

Councillor M Reed reported that the next meeting is on November 25th,he requested that Councillors email any questions that they would like him to put forward.

10. LITTLE CLACTON PARISH FIELDS

The Chairman reported that the vertidraining to the field has now been done. This will alleviate flooding issues through the winter.

The Youth and Community Hall are continuing to be regularly used.

11. VILLAGE HALL

Councillor De Vaux Balbirnie reported that the Village Hall work is to be finished by Christmas (concrete apron around the edge), and the six new seats would be concreted in including the new wheelchair access roundabout. The broken ladder has been taped up, but residents are still using it, which is hazardous. The repair should be done soon. There is also a height restriction barrier being installed.

12. MILLENNIUM GREEN

Councillor M Balbirnie reported that the bank mandate forms have now been processed and, as a result, a grant form has been submitted to 'Awards for All' requesting a donation to cover the work on the fencing along the road boundary as well as around the pond. Other grant applications are being researched.

A request for a grant from Little Clacton Parish Council has been submitted, for an amount to be included in the Precept when it is drawn up in the next few months.

It is hoped that the work can be done before bird nesting season starts as we have already been advised that the whips, which have been donated by the Woodland Trust, are due to be sent out this month and will be planted inside the boundary fencing when it is in place.

Another date is to be arranged shortly to carry out work around the pond area but we will have to work with the weather.

The information including accounts for the last fiscal year is due to be sent off to the Charity Commission by email to ensure that the information they have on record is correct.
